RESOLUTIONS

1. Mt Vernon Sr Citizens: Be it resolved that the Little Hunting Creek Citizens Association brings to the attention of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors the need for the assignment of full time county employees to coordinate and manage the activities of established Sr Citizens Clubs in the county now being run almost exclusively by volunteer efforts of individual residents. Be it further resolved that the Board of Supervisors address their attention to the need to budget for and support recreation and social services type activities for Sr Citizens in club activities now non-existing because of a lack of volunteer help.

2. Pet Control: Be it resolved that the Little Hunting Creek Citizens Association fully supports County Board of Supervisor plans and actions to rigidly enforce existing ordinances controlling and regulating the activities of privately-owned pets. Further be it resolved that the Little Hunting Creek Citizens Association supports legislative actions to review existing and promulgate new ordinances more forcefully protecting individual citizens lives and property from un-controlled acts of privately-owned pets.

It only happens four times a year. This is the second time that we, as your Executive Committee, who are concerned with our community affairs on a daily basis, request your support. Street lights or sidewalks, theater party or teen dance, clean-up or fencing, vandalism or Christmas decorations, evidence of our attempts to be of service and to get things done could not have escaped you completely.
