POSTAL SERVICE, ETC.

We have been fortunate that the Rexall Drug store in the Hollin Hall Shopping Center has had a Post Office in it - near, convenient and short lines. Now that store is closing and the Post Office too. We are pleased that we have now ascertained that the same type of service will be available in the new drug store which is going into the space formerly occupied by ACME food market. We consider this Post Office a necessary facility for our community and are pleased that we helped in getting it continued. While on postal service - the complaints about poor mail service is once again on the rise. We have contacted the proper authorities and continue in touch with them to determine what can be done to improve service. More importantly, why should we have to use Alexandria, Virginia as our mailing address? We don't live there, our mail service stems from Merrifield in Centerville of Fairfax County and the zip code is suppose to be the key to deliveries. The fact that we must use Alexandria has caused some to pay higher insurance premiums, get less travel allowances, etc. We have contacted both the postal authorities and our Congressman to see whether we can't get this changed. We know now that we could use our street address, the words Stratford Landing and then Northern Virginia, 22308 but that appears clumsy. We'll keep you informed as we get better data and formal responses from those contacted.

ANOTHER SERVICE FOR YOU

While on the subject, it has been years since the bus service from the Mt. Vernon area into the District commenced. By now it has more than proven itself. Until we get our Metro station at Huntington, this bus service certainly is an alternative to either car pooling or taking your car in each day. So, because we have so many new neighbors, here is an up-to-date extract of the current bus schedule specifically geared for our residents. Thanks to our transportation representative to the Council, Jim Bambery who compiled it. Display it in your home and use a bus to see how it works out if you don't want to avail yourself of our car pool referral service. It is attached in this Newsletter.

ENTRY SIGNS

For a number of years now, the question of whether we should have entry signs for our community, what type of sign and where they should be placed has been discussed and has been the subject of board and membership consideration. Lynn Adams, our VP has now been asked to do some spade work preparatory to bringing this matter to the membership for decision. The following determinations have been made: We would want identical signs at the old Burma Road now commonly known as Camden Causeway just after making a left turn off Stratford Lane to get into our community; at the corner of Riverside and Cavendish; at the entrance to the community from Elkin into Wittington and some sort of indication that one is entering Stratford Landing at the tri-corner of Londonderry, Elkin and Riverside. To build a large brick entrance with real fancy lettering which could not be easily removed would cost at least \$700.00 + per sign and the board feels this is too expensive. Lynn has been asked to recommend to the board either the type of sign which can be found at the entrance to Riverside Estates at Route 235 close to Good Shepherd Church, the type of sign which we had put up at Stratford Lane with the arrow pointing to Stratford Landing, or possibly something similar to what Waynewood has. Lynn will come up with cost figures and other details and by the time of the next membership meeting, the board will make its recommendations to you.

NOW READ THIS

With approaching July 4th celebrations, the Fairfax County Fire Prevention Bureau urges all County residents to exercise caution in the use of fireworks and to purchase only those approved for sale by licensed dealers.

Each year County citizens in the course of holiday celebrations, kill or maim themselves or loved ones through the use of fireworks, particularly illegal varieties. The latter includes all detonating devices (fire-crackers, cherry bombs, etc.) and items which shoot or propel a charge more than twelve feet into the air. Children are particularly susceptible to frightening and scarring injuries from illegal fireworks.

The transportation, sale, storage or use of fireworks other than those approved by the Fire Prevention Bureau is a criminal offense subject to heavy fines and/or imprisonment. Depending upon the nature of the individual incident, the simple act of exploding an illegal firework may involve a violation of County, State and Federal law. Additionally injuries or damages as a result of the misuse of any variety of fireworks may entail lengthy and costly civil litigation.

Last year, thirteen known injuries were investigated by the Fire Prevention Bureau in Fairfax County. Seventy per cent involved children. Injuries ranged from minor burns to the loss of eyesight and permanently crippling wounds.

HERE'S THE WORD

In past months, the problem of children playing in the streets, basketball nets on dedicated secondary roads, etc., have caused neighbors to get angry with each other and to create the sort of situations for which some suburbs are well known. To render information to you, the following article from a weekly County publication is quoted verbatim for your information:

Fairfax County parents should be aware, with the advent of summer vacation, that it is a violation of State law and County ordinance for children to ply in streets or highways unless the streets have been closed and designated by police as play areas.

County officials urge parents and others concerned with youngsters' activities to prevent them from roller skating, playing with toys or engaging in games on streets. It is also unlawful to ride any non-powered vehicle except a bicycle on streets.

Persons over 12 years of age are prohibited from riding bicycles or similar vehicles on sidewalks.

It also is unlawful to operate powered vehicles such as mini-bikes, which do not meet State safety standards, on any State or County road including subdivision streets. In addition, it is unlawful for any person without a driver's license to operate any powered vehicle on any thoroughfare, whether or not the vehicle meets State safety standards.

Mini-bikes may be operated by unlicensed drivers on private property or on school property or parkland only if the areas have been specifically designated for such use.

These prohibitions, concerned with public safety, are designed to protect participants, property and bystanders from traffic hazards.

Violators of the County ordinances are guilty of a misdemeanor and, if convicted, are subject to a fine of up to \$25 per count.

JAPANESE BEETLES

Japanese Beetles have begun their annual attacks on our plants, gardens and lawns. They seem to be worse this year than in the past. Once again one of our residents has done some research - this time with the County agricultural agent. It appears that there is one commercial activity, in Leesburg, which, using an accepted deterrent spray guarantees that a one-time treatment will eliminate this plague permanently. To be effective not just one but a lot of residents must join in - otherwise the contractor who is booked for months ahead won't come in and the treatment will not be effective. Initial indications are that this one-time treatment will cost about \$15.00 and that'll do it. We're getting the data from Leesburg. In the interim, we need to know how many residents would participate in this one-time program so that we can get it scheduled. Please consider this and call your block captain or telephone 780-9388 and tell us whether you'd join in??

PUBLIC SAFETY - YOUR BUSINESS

We still have our community Service Police Officer - still assigned to our area. We still strongly urge you to please bring all matters relevant to Public Safety to our attention. We still caution you to protect your property. This past month we have had two serious vehicular accidents in our community and, within one 24 hour period, seven larcenies and/or break-ins. We still have adults and youngsters cruising at night on bikes through the community without as much as a single reflector - or a light of any kind. Are we being repetitive? You bet!! We can compare our community with any in this county - we have less trouble, less incidents than any other of comparable size - because we try to be cohesive - try to caution everyone that we just won't tolerate the speeders, the draggers, the late noise makers and those who endanger our children's lives and our property. Let us know when you are offended so that we can take cohesive action. Lock your homes!! Keep lights on!! Let your neighbors know your plans!! Secure your bikes - when you see vans in the neighborhood, call your neighbors and inquire whether they belong to them - if not, call the police and call us!! Public Safety is all of our job - don't let something happen to your neighbor - you might be next!!

NOW'S THE TIME

In July we plan to meet with representatives of the County and the State Highway Department to go through the community pointing out some of the faults in our road system. We know of the old Burma Road indentations, the holes and dips on Londonderry and Cavendish, the unacceptable condition of Yardley and we solicit your calls right now (780-9388) to highlight other road conditions which we should get corrected. Concomitantly, the time has come to improve the traffic flow in our community by moving the stop sign from the corner of Cavendish and Camden to Londonderry and Camden. Londonderry is a wider road, it has better access from Fort Hunt, etc. Before we propose such a change, let's hear from you!! We do not want to make Camden a through street - we think at least one stop sign to slow down speeders is required and, we cannot get a four way stop street. Otherwise, we are open to your suggestions before we meet with the people who can change things.

RIGHT ON, RIGHT ON

The time has come to once again express our sincere appreciation to our more than thirty block captains. Many have recently departed and our membership chairman has had quite a task trying to find volunteers to replace them - some have served for as long as eight years. The job of block captain means quite a bit of work especially during the membership drive. It means being responsible for getting the Newsletter out to the block or finding someone to take on the job. During the year, it isn't too much work but it is a responsibility which is omnipresent. To all of the great gals and guys who are now representatives on each block our thanks and appreciation. Should you be called by Peggy Buss and asked to take the job, won't you agree, please? We now have one small part of one street without a captain (Porter Lane) - won't you please contact Peggy at 180-1005 and volunteer your service? Community service, without remuneration and without too much open credit, still finds its rewards in the realization that you are doing something for the good of others.
