# SLCA Referendum concerning proposed amendments to the Fairfax County Comprehensive Plan

Under Section 4.8 of the SLCA By-laws, the SLCA Executive Committee (EC) is conducting a referendum concerning proposed amendments to the Fairfax County Comprehensive Plan (the Comprehensive Plan) as it pertains to the Little Hunting Creek Pumping Station (the Pumping Station).

## OVERVIEW

The Comprehensive Plan, termed "The People's Plan" by **Planning Commission** Chairman Pete Murphy, is required by state law to be used as a guide in decision-making about the built and natural environment by the County's Board of Supervisors and other agencies, such as the Planning and Zoning Commission and the Board of Zoning Appeals. It provides land use recommendations for all of the properties located in Fairfax County. Every five years, an Area Plans Review (APR) process is commenced including a window of opportunity during which citizens, developers, and other parties may propose "nominations" to amend the Comprehensive Plan. During the APR process, after a nomination is filed, the County Staff reviews it to

ensure that it complies with formal requirements and then assesses the nomination and prepares a Staff Report. Supervisor Hyland will appoint a task-force made up of citizens of the Mount Vernon District that will review all of the nominations in the Mount Vernon District. The task-force reviews the Staff Report prepared for each nomination, and provides the Planning Commission with its own recommendation for each nomination. The Planning Commission votes up or down on each nomination and those that survive the Planning Commission go to the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors (BOS) to be voted upon. Those approved by the BOS result in corresponding amendments to the Comprehensive Plan. You may download and review the Area Plans Review Guide published by the County at the following link:

## THE EXISTING COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

Within the window of opportunity for proposing nominations, **two nominations were filed proposing amending the Comprehensive Plan concerning the Pumping Station.** In the **current plan**, the wording regarding the Pumping Station reads as follows:

"The site of the Little Hunting Creek Treatment Plant is planned

for community-serving public facilities that will be compatible with the surrounding existing and proposed residential uses. Should the property be declared surplus for public use, residential use at a density of 2-3 dwelling units per acre is appropriate. Any future development should not encroach into the 100-year floodplain."

## THE FIRST NOMINATION

The former Little Hunting Creek Treatment Plant located on Thomas J. Stockton Parkway in Sector MV6 was converted to a Pumping Station, still in operation. The property is planned for community-serving public facilities that will be compatible with the surrounding existing residential uses, and with its sensitive environmental character. Portions not in use by DPWES should be preserved as open space.

Consideration should be given to consolidating portions of this 9.6 acre parcel with the adjacent 1.8 are parcel 102-3((02))A owned by the Northern Virginia Conservation Trust, which is almost entirely freshwater tidal wetlands.

The first nomination proposes to amend the Comprehensive Plan

(from page 2) language in three respects:

(1) To replace the identification of the facility currently identified as "Treatment Plant" with the designation "Pumping Station" to reflect its current use.

(2) To designate portions of the property not in use by DPEWS to "open space."

(3) To suggest the possibility of consolidation of at least some of the lands designated "open space" with an adjacent property owned by the Northern Virginia Conservation Trust.

**THE SECOND NOMINATION**

The site of the Little Hunting Creek Treatment Plant Pumping Station is planned for community-serving public facilities that will be compatible with the surrounding existing and proposed residential uses. Security of the site should be maintained for the protection and safety of the Pumping Station facility and the surrounding community.

Should the property be declared surplus for public use, residential use at a density of 2-3 dwelling units per acre is appropriate. Any future development should not encroach into the 100-year floodplain.

Changes in zoning designation, decisions regarding consolidation with adjacent lands and/or issues of Stratford Landing community access or public access require approval by a consensus of the

surrounding Stratford Landing community.

The second Nomination proposes to amend the Comprehensive Plan language in three respects:

(1) To replace the identification of the facility currently identified as "Treatment Plant" with the designation "Pumping Station" to reflect its current use.

(2) To add language concerning the maintenance of the security of the site for the protection and safety of the facility and the surrounding community.

(3) To place in the Comprehensive Plan the assurance that changes in zoning, consolidation with adjacent lands, or community or public access to the site will require approval by a consensus of the surrounding Stratford Landing community.

**Reason for the Referendum**

This referendum is being held to obtain a vote of the SLCA membership concerning whether SLCA members favor one or the other nomination or neither of them. In other words, SLCA members will have three choices upon which to vote:

(1) A vote in favor of the first nomination.

(2) A vote in favor of the second nomination.

(3) A vote opposing both nominations which would be a recommendation to leave the Comprehensive Plan wording in its current form.

This referendum was occasioned by the filing of the two nominations. Changes in the Comprehensive Plan concerning the Pumping Station directly affect the Stratford Landing community. Were the Stratford Landing community to take no position concerning the nominations, the task-force, Planning Commission, and BOS would be required to make decisions concerning the nominations solely in reliance upon testimony from the nominators and other members of the public who testify at public hearings. Given the controversy surrounding past proposals for access to the Pumping Station lands, it is imperative that the Stratford Landing community explicitly express its views concerning the nominations to provide the task-force, Planning Commission, and BOS information essential to support the wishes of our community during the process. Neither nomination concerns a park or public access, which is outside the scope of the APR process.

**RELEVANT ARGUMENTS FOR/ AGAINST EACH NOMINATION**

Section 4.8 of the SLCA Bylaws

No!



requires that a referendum set forth the relevant arguments “on each side of the issue.” In this case, we interpret that to mean providing the community the relevant arguments for and against each of the three possible votes. In keeping with this requirement, we submit the following arguments for and against each of the three options:

### A. NOMINATION 1

Proponents of the first Nomination assert the following:

(1) That a vote in favor of the first nomination would indicate approval of amendment of the Comprehensive Plan to correct the identification of the facility from its current description as a “Treatment Plant” to its current designated use as a “Pumping Station.”

(2) That a vote in favor would also be a vote in favor of designating those portions of the property not in use by DPEWS as “open space” and to favor considering consolidation of at least some of those lands with the adjacent NVCT property.

(3) That changing the land use designation to “open space” would provide guidance to the Board of Supervisors if and when they consider declaring portions of the site surplus.

(4) That building houses in this area could have an adverse impact on the quality of the waters of Little Hunting Creek, the Potomac,

and the Chesapeake Bay because of the increase in impervious surface the houses would create.

(5) That a vote in favor would facilitate preservation portions of the parcel not in use by Fairfax County DPWES in a natural state as open space.

(6) That a vote in favor would allow possible future stewardship by an environmental group whose goal is to preserve the native vegetation and plants on the parcel.

(7) Potential consolidation of County lands with a private non-profit organization would be a plus – that changing the land use designation to “open space” is advantageous.

(8) The possible consolidation of those “open space lands with the adjacent NVCT property would further assure that those lands would not be developed for single family residences in the future.

### Opponents of the first Nomination assert:

(1) A designation of the Pumping Station lands as “open space” would mean that so long as the land was owned by the County, any access to Little Hunting Creek through the Pumping Station lands would have to be to include the general public.

(2) Changing the land use designation to “open space” may diminish the tax assessment of the Pumping Station lands.

### B. THE SECOND NOMINATION

Proponents of the second nomination assert the following:

(1) That a vote in favor of the second nomination would indicate approval of amendment of the Comprehensive Plan to correct the identification of the facility from its current description as a “Treatment Plant” to its current designated use as a “Pumping Station.”

(2) That a vote in favor would also be a vote in favor of stating in the Comprehensive Plan that the County should maintain security of the site for the protection and safety of the Pumping Station facility and the surrounding community.

(3) That a vote in favor would also be a vote in favor of stating in the Comprehensive Plan the assurance that changes in the character of use of the Pumping Station lands will not occur in the absence of a consensus of the Stratford Landing community in favor. Proponents of the second Nomination assert that Supervisor Hyland often supports the consensus of adjacent affected communities on issues of land use. If the community opposes the second Nomination, this language would not be included in the Comprehensive Plan and there could be no assurance that a Supervisor succeeding Supervisor Hyland in the future would respect the community’s views concerning



land use decisions at the pumping station.

(4) That a vote in favor of the second Nomination would maintain the current land use designation and thereby preserve the ability of the County to determine that not all of the 9.6 acres are necessary to preserve the safety and security of the Pumping Station facility. If such determination was made, excess land could be sold to a developer with the proviso that some of the land so conveyed would be used by the developer to create a Creek access limited to Stratford Landing residents.

(5) That a vote in favor would maintain the current zoning designation and also maintain the current tax assessment for the Pumping Station lands.

#### **Opponents of the second Nomination assert:**

(1) The second Nomination will not preclude development of single family residences on the Pumping Station lands.

(2) The proposed change would require community consensus only if the land was consolidated or the zoning were changed to "open space" or some other other density besides R-3.

(3) That the current zoning designation leaves the parcel open to development if declared surplus by the County, although the amount of of land to be developed

is limited and a public hearing would occur.

(4) That the insertion of language about maintenance of security at the site may have no effect. The Comprehensive Plan is a tool for guiding land use decisions. Presumably, the County maintains the security of all its sites.

#### **C. STATUS QUO**

A vote in favor of leaving the Comprehensive Plan as is would be a vote against both of the above-discussed nominations. It would leave the Comprehensive Plan unchanged and mean that the voter prefers that the Stratford Landing Civic Association take the position that the Comprehensive Plan remain unchanged. Those who believe it is unnecessary to amend the Comprehensive Plan should favor this option. Those who believe changes ought to be made to the Comprehensive Plan should vote for the first or second nomination.

#### **THE BALLOT**

The SLCA EC will report the results of the referendum to the community, the MVCCA, the APR task-force, the Planning Commission, and the BOS. In so doing, the SLCA EC will report the vote totals in favor of each of the three voting options.

The referendum will be placed on the agenda of the annual meeting

to be held on October 20th, 2009, so that SLCA members may ask any questions they may have. The Members of the SLCA will be given one month after the annual meeting (November 20th) within which to cast their votes on the referendum ballot provided.

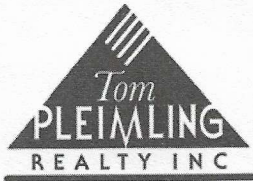

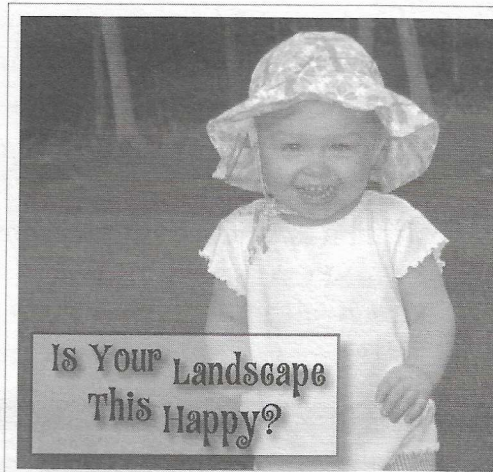
