# **Open Positions**

Public Safety Delegate to the MVCCA

The Public Safety Committee is an interface between the MVCCA and the Fairfax County Police Department, Sheriff's Office, Fire and Rescue Department, and Office of Emergency Management.

The Committee meets at 7:30 PM on the first Thursday of each month (except August) in Room 3 of the Mount Vernon Government Center.

#### Neighborhood Watch Coordinator

The role of the neighborhood watch coordinator is to make sure everyone in the group has a way to communicate with each other (emails, text, and cell phones). They also are the person who works with the police department on issues in your neighborhood. They coordinate the flow of communication in the neighborhood to make sure everyone is aware of any issues or situations going on. The biggest responsibility is to recruit people to be involved in neighborhood watch. This person will <u>not</u> replace law enforcement; criminal activity should still be reported directly to the police department. Fairfax County provides training for the Neighborhood Watch Coordinator.

# Voting Information

#### **November Ballot Information**

You may vote in-person on November 3; vote in-person absentee beginning October 14; or request an absentee ballot online (Ballots will be available beginning September 18). No reason is required to request an absentee ballot this year. The online submission is

not automatic. All absentee and voter registration forms must be approved and will be processed in the order of receipt.

Go to: <u>https://vote.elections.virginia.gov/VoterInformation</u> to register, check status, or request an absentee ballot.

#### **Returning an Absentee Ballot**

For security and integrity of the ballot, Virginia law does not currently allow for the use of drop boxes for returning absentee ballots. The law requires ballots to be returned by mail to the Office of the General Registrar or delivered personally to the General Registrar at 12000 Government Center Parkway, Suite 323, Fairfax, VA 22035.

During the dates and times that the satellite locations are open, voters can return ballots to the Assistant Registrars. To repeat, **ONLY when the satellite locations are open** can a voter return a ballot to the Assistant Registrar.
